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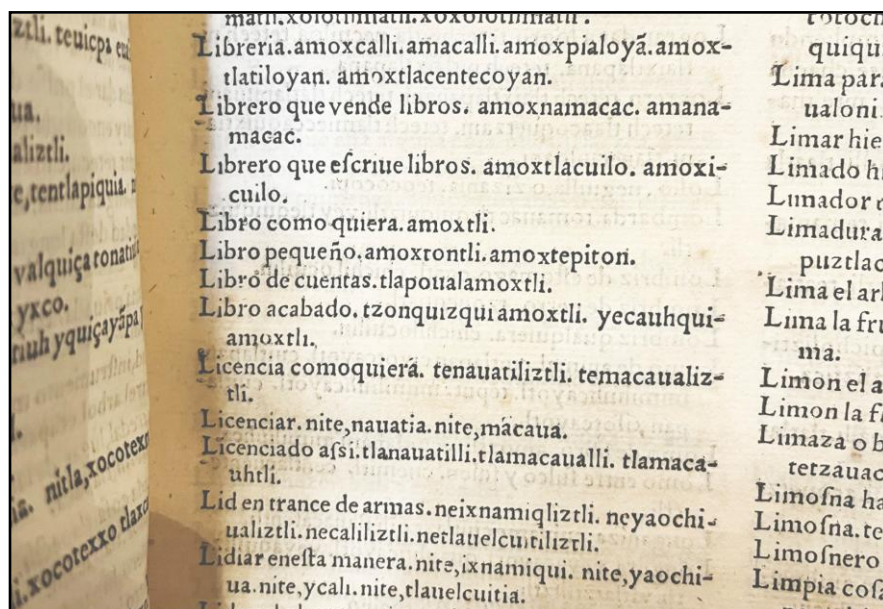

This talk examines bibliographical concepts and practices in the study of early printed books in Latin America, ranging from the first printed books in Mexico and Peru in Indigenous languages in the sixteenth century to publications in multiple formats produced in other regions during the colonial period.



DAVID FERNÁNDEZ is a librarian and instructor at the University of Toronto. As Head of the Department of Rare Books and Special Collections, he works with a team of librarians, archivists, and library staff to offer library services and access to extensive holdings of archives, print and manuscript collections. David teaches bibliography, library studies, and book history and print culture at the iSchool and in the Book History & Print Culture (BHPC) Collaboration.
